The City of Saratoga Springs is applying for funds to purchase and plant 110 street trees in two areas identified as high priorities in its recently adopted Urban and Community Forest Master Plan. DPW crews will partner with a local non-profit, Sustainable Saratoga, to employ volunteers to plant 90 trees in the downtown urban core and 20 trees in an underserved neighborhood just off Broadway. New tree wells with new topsoil and proper planting techniques will ensure the project's success.

 The Southwest Neighborhood is located within census tract block groups 612.001 and 612.006, identified by the
 U.S. HUD as a low-moderate income area with 56.7% and 74.2%, respectively, of the population earning less than 80% of the Area Median Income. Streets include Congress, Hamilton, West Circular, Union, South and Aletta streets.
- 2. Trees in this area would have a particular impact on physical and mental health as well as home energy costs – important savings for families trying to make ends meet, making Saratoga Springs more affordable for people of all income levels. Many of the streets in this area are also used by locals trying to avoid the traffic common to Broadway. Trees in this area would also help to calm traffic and ameliorate the extra concentration of exhaust pollution generated by these traffic patterns.

Provide an overview of the project including goals, tasks, desired outcomes and performance measures:

The City of Saratoga Springs is applying for funds to purchase and plant 110 street trees in two areas identified as high priorities in its recently adopted Urban and Community Forest Master Plan. DPW crews will partner with a local non-profit, Sustainable Saratoga, to employ volunteers to plant 90 trees in the downtown urban core and 20 trees in an underserved neighborhood just off Broadway. New tree wells with new topsoil and proper planting techniques will ensure the project's success.

Trees will be planted during three separate work events, ideally planned near Arbor Day in the three years following grant approval. A typical tree installation will entail City DPW staff cutting and removing a 40 SF hole (per the Master Plan) in the sidewalk. Holes may be 5'x8' or 4'x10' depending on site conditions. DPW crews may also use heavy equipment to loosen the soil in the new opening. Teams of volunteers would then excavate all of the soil from the hole. DPW staff will then deliver approximately 1.5 cubic yards of top soil which will be added to the hole by the volunteers. Soil will be added to the hole and compacted to the height needed for proper root ball planting depth (based on height of the root collar). The addition of new top soil will be accompanied by an addition of a mycorrhizal fungi inoculant to improve the growth potential of these trees planted in the harsh urban environment. From that point on, volunteers would plant the tree following the procedures for proper tree planting as outlined in Attachment 2 of the RFA including proper handling, layered soil compaction, watering, staking, and mulching. Professional volunteers from Sustainable Saratoga, as well as members of the City Tree Crew, will supervise volunteer plantings.

As part of this project, Sustainable Saratoga will recruit volunteers to aid in the tree plantings as well as to be volunteer tree tenders. Tree tenders will be assigned to monitor and maintain the trees for a period of at least 2 years. Responsibilities will include routine watering for the first year of establishment and then watering during rain-free periods in year 2. They will also maintain proper mulching and remove stabilizing staking after the first year as well as inform the City Arborist if any serious maintenance issues arise.
